LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

As one might expect in the computer age, things electronic played a major role in the workings of the library in 2015. We replaced our file server early in the year, but had to work through a number of issues related to this acquisition which required some time to sort out. At the same time, it was decided to change to a GFI monitoring service. This does not save us money, but it does simplify our technology requirements. In addition, after much discussion, the Board decided to install a card lock system to control access to the book drop. This will be ready for implementation in the New Year.

For the first time, we took part in the Toronto-Dominion's summer reading program, complete with a party sponsored by the bank. Our young participants proved to be very enthusiastic readers over the summer months! This program was funded, in part, by the Portage la Prairie Community Revitalization Corporation. Meyer, Norris and Penny provided funding for the teen portion of the activities.

This was a very busy year, but perhaps the most unusual event involved bedbugs. A patron approached us with the concern that there had been bedbugs found in books borrowed from the library. The City brought in a dog trained to sniff out the bugs, and, to our good fortune, none were located. Watching the dog at work, however, was an education in itself.

The library is fortunate in having a Board, staff, and volunteers, whose goal is to provide excellent service. I would like to thank them for their efforts in accomplishing this.
